





Sanctity of Human Life Sunday - "Defending and Caring for the Most Vulnerable"

Since 1984, churches across the country have recognized the third Sunday in January as Sanctity of Human Life Sunday. Today we celebrate God's precious gift of life while sadly remembering the 62,000,000 lives lost to abortion as well as the physical, spiritual, and psychological brokenness it can inflict on those involved.

The Mission Statement of the Sanctity of Life Ministry states: "The Sanctity of Life Ministry proclaims and supports the sanctity and dignity of all human life from conception to its natural end by working to bring an end to abortion, by extending Christian love and compassion to those wounded by abortion, and by protecting the weak and vulnerable during all phases of life."

Today we face many threats to the sanctity of human life besides abortion: euthanasia, genocide, genetic engineering, and eugenics. You can commit to defending and caring for the most vulnerable by volunteering at a pregnancy resource center; being a witness to and praying for those hurt by abortion; and supporting the WPC Sanctity of Life ministry. As Jesus said in Matthew 25:40, "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it unto me."
